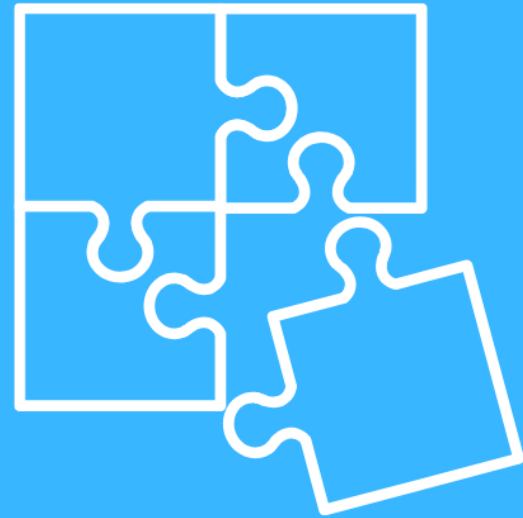

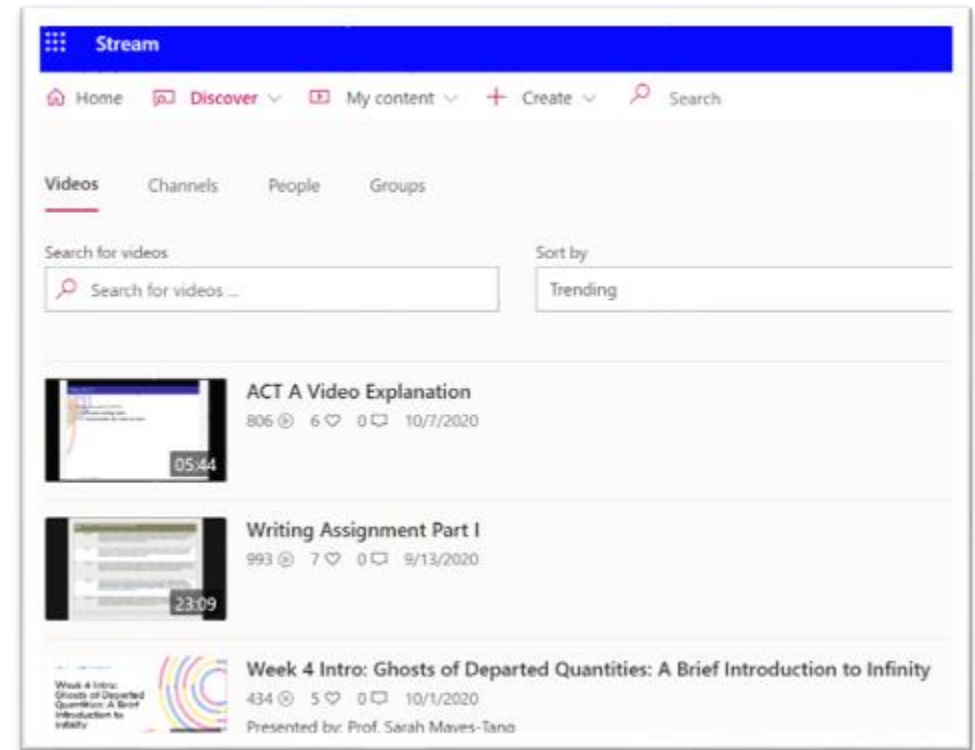


What is Microsoft Stream?

- Microsoft Stream is a secure video service that allows you to share recordings of classes, meetings, presentations, training sessions and related videos.
- With Stream, users can access their videos on multiple devices from any location and deliver both live and on-demand videos to curated audiences.
- Stream also offers a number of features. These features include:
 - Speech to text and auto-generated closed captions.
 - Flexible permission settings.
 - Custom video libraries that can be organized by audience and topic.
 - Video commenting.
 - Time code tags to refer colleagues to specific parts of videos.
 - With Stream and Office 365, you can access endless potential for team collaboration across a secure application.

Stream at U of T

- Stream is an organizational tool: this means that you need to be logged in to your U of T account in order to access it and view videos.
- Stream is available to all full time staff and faculty at the University across all three campuses.
- While students can't use it to upload videos, they can still log in to view Stream videos that have been made available to them via their Office 365 accounts.
- At UofT, Stream can be used when you want to share video content with University audiences.
- To access Stream, go to **mail.utoronto.ca** and click on the waffle in the top left corner. Click **Stream**.
